We celebrate in worship the various ways in which a community of diverse people praise God!

Sunday Services

Because of the Coronavirus, Sunday worship times are subject to change in 2020 and 2021. Live, in-person service takes place Sunday mornings. Online worship is available each Sunday.

Ecumenical Prayer & Supper – Annual

Dinner, followed by worship with various congregations in Chico



Taizé Prayer and Labyrinth Walk – Seasonal

Worship and contemplative prayer using the elements of walking the Labyrinth and confession.

Ash Wednesday – Spring

Imposition of Ashes and Holy Communion.

Wednesdays in Lent – Spring

Gather with community churches to share ecumenical Wednesday-evening suppers with great food and inspiring worship.

Sunday of the Passion (Palm Sunday) - Holy Week

Gather with palms in the courtyard and process into worship, led by the cross.

Maundy Thursday - Holy Week

Holy Communion with foot washing and Stripping of the Altar.

Good Friday – Holy Week

Adoration of the cross.

Vigil of Easter – Holy Week

Lighting of the Paschal flame and candle, vigil reading, and song. Baptism, Holy Communion, followed by celebration.

Easter Day - Holy Week

Two services with Holy Communion led by choir, brass, contemporary musicians and organ.

Day of Pentecost - May

Two services with Holy Communion led by choir, brass, contemporary musicians and organ.

Ember Days – September, December, March

Prayerful, seasonal reflection and attention to how God is revealed in creation; allowing nature and seasonal cycles to inform our understanding of God and of ourselves.

St. Francis Blessing of the Animals - October

Blessing of the Animals in the courtyard.



All Saints Day – November

Bring photographs, place flowers, light candles, pray, and sing to remember our loved ones. Service concludes with a blessing at the Columbarium.

Women's Thankoffering Sunday

The women of our congregation (and the ELCA) collect what they've saved for the year and is given to the WELCA organization.

Wednesdays in Advent – November, December

Gather for evening suppers and inspirational worship.

Advent Workshop – December

Faith's coup de grâce; arts, crafts, music and worship during our Advent season, including gift wrapping, chili cook-offs, and fun for everyone.



Christmas Eve – December 24

Children's Service: Holy Communion service especially for children followed by concert of choral and organ music.

Candlelight Service: Holy Communion with candle-lighting and song.

Christmas Day – December 25

Casual worship the morning of Christmas.

FAITH MUSIC

FAITH EDUCATION

Faith is a congregation that likes to take action, and the first step to taking action is learning about our community. We at Faith are blessed to have so many opportunities to learn from one another, whether it be from different congregations, from people young and old, or from our own neighbors.

Online Bible Study

Deepen your worship experience studying the Gospel lesson for the upcoming Sunday. Background, context and literary information, commentaries and questions for reflection intend to bring the Word of God into your everyday life. This study provides some tools that may increase your comfort studying the Scriptures on your own. Hard copies are available in the sanctuary.

Pastor's Bible Study - Tuesday afternoons

How does the pastor go from the bible passages assigned each week to the Sunday morning sermon? Come find out and be a part of the process! Study the upcoming Sunday's bible passages with Pastor Ben. We will talk a little about history and context, then focus on using Martin Luther's techniques for understanding how the bible addresses the needs and concerns of our community today.

Women's Bible Study - September through June

The Mary and Martha Bible Study group and Elizabeth Bible Study group welcomes all women who are looking for Christian fellowship and study of the scripture. Our study guide is the Lutheran women's magazine Gather.

Faith Adult Christian Education (FACE)

Faith Lutheran Church has been offering FACE classes for 30 years, and contrary to our last What's Happening at Faith claiming that 2019 will be our best year, 2020 will be our best! Join us for bible studies, discussions on a broad range of topics, ecumenical activities with other congregations, and more.

Sacred Conversations

Sacred Conversations is a monthly forum that takes place in the Sanctuary, addressing relevant topics and hosting panelists from all wakes of life. Such panels have included Immigration, Preparing for Death, and more.

FIRST THIRD of LIFE



Sunday School

Those ages 0-9 and their parents/guardians are welcome to join us for Sunday School in the nursery. Sunday School focuses on Holy playtime, singing, prayer, and storytelling. During the COVID pandemic, we have been meeting weekly for a virtual kids call, which follows a similar format to Sunday School.

Confirmation

Those entering 6th grade are invited to learn more about the Bible, what it means to be Lutheran, and how to live out the gospel in their daily lives through weekly classes. Upon completion of classes, these youth are welcomed to become voting members of Faith Lutheran and are confirmed. Confirmation is an important milestone in the faith journey of our youth, and we welcome mentors to walk alongside our confirmation students as "trekkers" who join them on their journey of faith.

Youth Group

Middle and High School youth are encouraged to attend weekly youth group at Faith. This is time to be in community with one another, share in our journey of faith, and learn more about our relationship with God. During COVID, youth group has transitioned to weekly online video calls, which are similar to regular weekly youth group: check-in, devotion time, fun games, and prayer.

College

Those ages 18-35 and enrolled in continuing education are welcomed to be part of our unique college Faith Lutheran community. During the school year, the group is welcomed for dinner at the homes of various Faith members, with discussion and fellowship following the meal. During COVID, the group continued to meet but is taking a break for the summer, and will reconvene at a regular weekly time once the school year begins again.


PRAYER and SUPPORT MINISTRIES

Centering Prayer – Tuesdays at 4pm

The contemplative prayer method of Father Thomas Keating is used in this ongoing ecumenical practice. Those new to the practice, as well as those with experience, are welcome. Starting with a brief reading and musical piece, a 20 minute silent, contemplative sit follows. The upcoming Sunday's gospel is then read as *lectio devina* (reading the word with the heart), followed by voluntary naming of what stood out to each listener. We are a member of the Contemplative Outreach Sacramento/Stockton Area (COSSA) organization who offer area centering prayer events and classes and who are a resource for people searching for a local centering prayer group.

Ignatian Prayer

Ignatian Prayer uses a practice called *examen*. The primary questions asked are where have you felt connected to God since we last met and where have you felt disconnected. We encourage other members to step into this journey.



Ember Days

Another contemplative practice is paying attention the the change of the seasons of the year. It is called *Ember Days* and happens around the time when we move from Spring to Summer to Fall to Winter. This is usually a morning event held here at Faith. The practices engaged are Prayer Collage, Labyrinth, and Nature walks.



Stephen Ministry is a program in which trained laypeople provide confidential, one-on-one Christian care to individuals in our congregation and community who are going through difficult times. Stephen Ministers listen non-judgmentally to their care receivers, providing care, support, encouragement, and prayer. Stephen Ministry is confidential; the identity of those receiving care and what is discussed in the caring relationship remains private. Who needs a Stephen Minister? Anyone going through a difficult time, including but not limited to those suffering from the death of a loved one, hospitalization, illness, job loss, disability, natural disaster, divorce, infertility, birth of a special needs child, unwanted pregnancy, miscarriage, parenting struggles, empty nest, mild to moderate depression, trouble with the law, or others.

Taizé Prayer

Taize Evening prayer is a practice done jointly with worship and Contemplative prayer at special seasons of the year, i.e. All Saints. In Holy week on Monday-Wednesday we gather in morning prayer using the Labyrinth following prayer and confession. The Labyrinth was then put in the Fellowship Hall for the remaining of Holy Week, Thursday- Saturday. On the third Sunday of the month during worship members may have a healing minister pray for concerns that they lift up to the healing minister. We invite all to step into this practice as it gives opportunity to reflect on how you proclaim Jesus Christ to the world through you actions.

Prayer Chain

Do you have a prayer request or concern for which you would like our church community to pray? *Call us!* We will reach out to Faith members and let them know that somebody you care about is in need of prayer.

COMMITTEES at FAITH

Church Council

Our council is comprised of a president, VP, secretary, and treasurer as well as a handful of other council members. As a team, they provide support to our staff and congregation and help manage finances, policies, and oversight of our building.

Columbarium

The Columbarium Garden is being used by the Faith Family as a place of contemplation, worship and remembrance, and is a very special and unique feature of our church. It is a memorial garden where congregation members and their family may inurn the ash remains of loved ones in a beautiful and holy setting.



Endowment

The endowment fund provides for mission work beyond the operational budget of this congregation, as well as support for mission work at home and around the world, strengthening and extending God's mission through Faith Lutheran Church. It reaches out in response to human need by making grants to promote and support education for Christian life and service.

Funeral Committee

This committee provides lunches or light food for memorial or funeral services, including set-up and clean-up, and is of great help during life's most challenging moments.

SOCIAL MINISTRY

The **Social Ministry Team** seeks to connect Faith Lutheran to our broader community, locally, regionally, nationally, and globally, through acts of service and solidarity. The team meets once monthly and is still meeting during the COVID19 pandemic via zoom instead of in-person.

- **Blessing of the Backpacks:** the collection and distribution of backpacks and supplies for school students.
- Blue Bags (Chico Food Project): a collection of food donated by the congregation to benefit the hungry in the Chico area.
- CHAT Thanksgiving: coming together in November to provide a meal for the Chico Housing Action Team
- **Disaster Response:** response to disasters like the Camp Fire or Coronavirus in which Faith organizes food, mask, and bedding distribution as well as emotional support like the sending of thank-you or birthday cards, flowers, etc.
- God's Work, Our Hands: a day of all-congregational community service in lieu of traditional worship.
- **Jesus Center Breakfasts:** a once-monthly means of community service in which we make breakfast for the Jesus Center.
- Rancho Santa Marta: annual, week-long service trip to Mexico to help with construction projects and other important tasks.
- **Rise Against Hunger:** packaging meals to send out across the world in order to feed the hungry.
- **Rwanda:** connection with our sister parish in Kagitumba, Rwanda, who we support in prayer and finances as they build their new church
- **Torres Shelter Dinners:** going to the Torres Shelter monthly to prep and disperse meals to those without homes in Chico



WOMEN'S, MEN'S, and PRIDE MINISTRIES

The **Women's Ministry** hosts various bake sales throughout the year, raising funds for scholarships that go to college or trade school, and providing paratransit tickets to folks that need a way to church. Some of these bake sale are accompanied by boutiques in which the Women's Ministry and others at Faith provide hand-made items to sell. Women's Thankoffering Sunday is hosted by this ministry as well as the Quilters who, each Tuesday (barring Shelter in Place) meet in the Parish Hall to craft beautiful quilts with the fabric they store at the church.



The **Men's Ministry** enjoys engaging in good conversation over breakfast each Friday at 7am. While Shelter in Place is in effect, the men meet over Zoom. Otherwise, they meet at Farmer's Skillet on Rio Lindo Avenue.

The **Pride,** or LGBTQ+ ministry, is the force behind the booth that we host each year at the downtown pride festival. We collaborate often with Stonewall Alliance not only for the downtown festival, but for Transgender Day of Remembrance in November and World AIDS Day in December as well as providing LGBTQ+ education here at the church.
