A big thank you to **Kathy Mahannah** for designing **Faith's new logo!** The logo is designed to match our new mission statement, "A community reflecting God's love with a place at the table for everyone." This logo depicts that statement in multiple ways. First, the logo's basic shape is based on the classic symbol for the Eucharist, a communion wafer held above a chalice. This symbolizes the Lord's table to which all are welcome. However, the communion wafer is composed of the ELCA's logo, which is a multi-colored globe with the cross at its center. This symbolizes the call to reflect the love that God revealed on the cross out into the world with all its diversity. Finally, if you look closely, you will see the chalice is engraved with four figures with halos and a bible. These represent the four gospel writers who have passed onto us the Word, Jesus, who is both the Light that we reflect and the bread which we share at the table.



A Letter from Margaret Korte

Dear friends at Faith, this is a much belated thank you for your prayers, phone calls and condolence cards after my husband, Bill, passed away at Enloe Hospital from pneumonia as a result of Influenza A on March 24. We had been married for 56 years.

Not wanting me to be alone at the senior living facility, our daughter, Jennifer, drove to Chico 3 days after Bill died and brought me to her house in San Francisco. I have been here ever since. Jen's family consists of her husband, Chris, who now works at home, Calvin, their college age son, and soon-to-return-home college-graduate son, Alex, plus his three dogs. Five months ago, this was a house with two empty nesters. Suddenly, it became a bustling dwelling of three generations!

At this juncture, Covid-19 shows no sign of subsiding, so going back to Chico to live among other high risk seniors does not make sense. Continuing to pay a large monthly fee for my apartment at the senior living facility makes even less sense. So, I gave away most of my furniture, and had my worldly belongings packed up and brought to the Bay Area. Jennifer and her husband have kindly offered for me to live with them for the foreseeable future. I am grateful for the opportunity to be with family. Their guest room is quiet and comfortable. It has a bathroom, and a small sitting room that opens to the backyard. If I lift my eyes to the hills, I can see the Big Easter Cross on Mt. Davidson, when there is no fog.

Now I need to make a confession, and offer an **apology.** Last month I struggled to connect to the Faith Lutheran Live Virtual church service on a Sunday and encountered greater than usual difficulty. In a moment of desperation I clicked on Facebook hoping to get a better connection. Well, I didn't. Instead, it showed me a bunch of names of people I know who wanted to "Friend" me. This would be great if I was ready to navigate the realm of social media. But I am not. Not right now, because I don't have the spare mental energy. So, to those people hoping to connect with me on Facebook, I **apologize** that you won't get a reply from me. But then, I won't "Unfriend" you either because I don't know how!

I am doing fairly well considering the circumstances. I have had time to recover from the exhaustion of being a care giver. Now in my spare time I like to read (non-fiction) and listen to classical music, which also helps with healing. And there are also the many boxes of stuff to be unpacked. They will just have to wait...

September is usually the month when, after a summer of mission trips, camps, and pilgrimages, Faith regroups to kick off its fall programming. Our mission trips, camps, and pilgrimages were cancelled this year, but September will still be a month where Faith regroups!

In his President's article, Joel Zimbelman talks about some of the great ways that Faith will be encouraging people to connect online during the fall. But we recognize that for many people connecting over the internet is technologically challenging and/or emotionally unfulfilling. This is particularly true for many of our most venerable members of Faith who are also our most vulnerable to Covid.

This fall, we will be trying out a few new programs designed to maximize in-person relationships while minimizing Covid dangers. In particular, we are looking to embrace the cutting-edge technology of the 1950s: drive-ins! We've purchased a short-range FM transmitter so that we can broadcast directly to your car radio when you park in our parking lot. For our first drive-in event, we'll do Bingo on Wednesday, Sept 16th at 10am in the church parking lot. All you need to do is drive up! We'll slip you bingo cards through your window and I'll broadcast bingo numbers and bible-based humor through your radio! If you win, honk your horn and flash your lights!

On Friday, Oct 2nd at 7pm we will also do a family drive-in movie night! On the side of the church, we'll project *The Sandlot*, a comedy about a summer of

friendship and adventure during which one boy becomes part of a team. Nine boys become best friends and their leader becomes a legend by confronting the terrifying mystery beyond the left field fence. The event will be free and open to the public. So bring your car, your snacks, and invite your friends!

We are also considering opening our courtyard to events beyond Sunday morning worship. One possibility is a time of fellowship either in the morning for coffee or in the evening with iced tea. People would be encouraged to bring their own beverage and lawn chair or picnic blanket, though we would have chairs available for any who need them. However, we aren't sure if there would be interest in this type of event. If you would be interested in sitting out, socially distanced and wearing masks, in the courtyard for fellowship, either in the morning or the evening, please contact the office and let us know. We are particularly interested in hearing from the senior members of our congregation.

This is a challenging time for everyone. Our new mission statement is to be "a community reflecting God's love with a place at the table for everyone." Jesus is always present with us, surrounding us with love. But sometimes when we are isolated it's hard to see him. As a congregation, we want to make sure each person can see and experience the presence of Christ's light in their life, no matter their health risk or access to technology. So thank you for all that you do to help us creatively connect with one another and reflect God's love during these challenging times.

A LETTER from the Council President

Dear Members of Faith, by the time you read this, school will be back in session, summer vacations (or what there was of them) will be behind us, and planning on new survival tactics for the fall will be keeping us all busy!

The Church staff and the Council have been exploring increased opportunities for Church worship, fellowship, prayer, and study in our new online environment (in addition to some face-to-face opportunities that Pr. Ben will highlight in his comments this month). **Online worship** at 11:00 a.m. will continue each Sunday into the fall, as will various **opportunities for prayer and study during the week**. And last month's email blast introduced our **Tables for Eight social opportunity** that gives you a chance to get to know some new faces and maybe develop some sustained relationships with other members of Faith.

In addition to these events, we'll be starting some new Zoom events in September. On Sunday mornings we'll be adding a FACE (Faith Adult Christian Education) Class from 10-10:50 a.m. (between our live Sunday service and the online 11 a.m. offering). That class will follow in the format of the FACE classes that we held for many years in our Fellowship Hall (we've had nearly 1000 FACE class meetings over the past 32 years!). Each class series will run an average of three weeks, and will focus on a Bible study, a discussion of some important topic central to our life as a church, or around conversations related to the life of prayer, service, spiritual development, and ethics. We're hoping to get some new members involved in teaching these classes, and so you will definitely see some new faces in the mix going forward.

And following the Sunday 11 a.m.-12 p.m. online worship, we will immediately be extending that time together into an **impromptu coffee hour on Zoom (and by phone) from 12 to about 12:30 p.m.** This will be a very unstructured time for you to reach out to a few fellow church members to connect, share stories, seek support, and stay in the loop on happenings at FLC. Details on topic schedules, how to sign in, and related issues will be forthcoming. Since one of the most challenging issues many of us are facing is loneliness, separation from loved ones, and feeling cramped up in our homes, these offerings will give all of us a chance to "get out there" and talk to and visit with others—if only for a few minutes!

Let me close with a few words on our FLC Stewardship and Capital Campaign. As of the 18th of August, we have received about \$89,000 in contributions toward our goal of \$125,000 for our new sanctuary sound system, cameras for broadcast, and some new lighting for our worship space. Thank you to all of you who have committed to this work, and to ongoing support for other capital projects during the coming years. As we get closer to our financial goal, we hope to start on that AV project so it is ready when we all move back into the sanctuary in the not- too-distant future.

In addition to refocusing efforts on the 11 AM service, the bell choir will be re-starting! If



- 1. Meeting called to order by Joel at 6:20 pm
- 2. Devotion Bonnie Pulliam
- 3. Opening Prayer Pr. Ben
- 4. Approval of minutes from last meeting. Two changes to name spellings. Meridith made motion to approve. Penny seconded. Motion passed.
- 5. Covenant read by everyone on council.
- 6. Financial Report Mark Kimmelshue
 - a. Operations & property is inflated due to last payment on furniture.
 - b. Doug wanted to know who keeps the backup documents to support the designated funds. Mark responded that Jeanette keeps the documentation.
 - c. Audio visual system shows the specific donations for the capital campaign. Total goal is approximately \$115,000.
 - d. Joel made motion to approve the financial report. Susan seconded. Motion passed.
- 7. Announcements and calendar events
 - a. Sunday Worship pastoral vacations and pulpit supply. Colter & Luke are currently on vacation. Pastor Ben will follow on vacation. Guest preaching has been lined up.
 - b. Evolving website Michael is working on the website and integrating QuickBooks into the budget component. Will also integrate giving from members as well as a login for the capital campaign.
 - Stewardship and Capital Campaign Letters have gone out which included mock up of possible new logo. Currently have approximately \$60,000 plus in pledges. Susan requested that all council members write a love letter for the capital campaign. Please send to Michael as an attachment to an email.
 - d. Email accounts Pastor Ben discussed phishing emails that have been received by many members. Suggested the creation of an official FLC email address for each staff member. Will cost approximately additional \$20 per year.
 - e. Internet Comcast is in the process of installing the new internet system in the church.
- 8. Asylum Committee Doug & Bonnie.

- a. Goal to raise a specific amount of funds to support a family for 6 to 12 months. Don't want move forward until commitments are in place. Have a fundraising committee in place and will also need to secure housing.
- b. Next meeting is Asylum committee meeting is August 17th.
- c. Working with other churches to help with fundraising and support. So far, most donations have come directly from the Faith Lutheran community.
- d. Will have updates at each council meeting.
- 9. New logo for FLC Pr. Ben sent out PDF for proposal of new logo. Includes a chalice and ELCA logo as the bread. Michael is looking locally for vendors for t-shirts, etc. Cindy recommended Recognition Products where members could order specific shirts, hats, mugs, etc. Meridith also suggested Limey Tees a local business here in Chico.
- 10. Life in the community during the lockdown, and how to strengthen it. Reflections from new and continuing Council members. Council's job is to engage members in an active and meaningful life during this social distancing. Council members were asked to selectively pick one of the following items to support. The top ideas were:
