There are so many new aspects to our live as a congregation. We are learning new ways to worship online. ASYLUM TEAM UPDATE

Hello, all, and thank you for your support of the Asylum Fund. Since Faith Lutheran began this fund, with the goal of raising money to sponsor someone legally seeking asylum, we have been able to raise over \$6,000! Way to go!

As the team moves forward, we are working to continue to build connections with fellow communities of faith here in Chico. Our fundraising subcommittee is busy planning our team's first community-wide fundraiser, so stay tuned for more details on how you can participate.

We are also still accepting any offers of potential housing for an individual or a family. If you have housing you would be willing to offer, such as a mother-in-law unit or even a working trailer with hookups, please email Colter at colter.g.murphy@gmail.com.

In addition to the fundraiser and our search for housing, we are seeking longterm, sustaining donors who can support our efforts through regular, recurring giving. The legal process of being granted asylum obtaining and а work authorization permit can be quite lengthy. As a team, we are committed to fully supporting whomever we sponsor through the entire process, with the end goal being complete self-sufficiency for the asylum seeker. We anticipate the possibility of walking alongside these siblings in Christ as sponsors for up to two years as they navigate the legal process and figure out their new lives in Chico. A LETTER from LUKE: ADJUSTING to the RETURN of LIVE WORSHIP



And just like that, here we are! June has nearly come and gone, Summer has officially started, and it's already warm out (at least the humidity is low, haha!)

June has been a challenging month for music and worship. At the beginning of the month we got the green flag to begin the reopening process at church under strict guidelines from Governor Newsom, the Butte County Health Officials and the CDC. One of the main challenges that we faced was coming back to worship and not being able to sing or create music in that way. A committee and I met and discussed/brainstormed ways that we could make music that required

no congregational or choral singing- a concept that is very counter-intuitive especially to our faith which draws much of its musical traditions from singing! Many of the ideas of the committee included more instrumental music such as drum circles, bells, use of the Orff instruments, instruments that don't require human made wind to sustain them, and much more.

Another big challenge that we've been facing is the continuation of livestreamed services even after it's safe for all to return to in-person worship. Throughout this difficult time, the online ministry has reached many people who haven't been able to worship with us due to a number of reasons such as health, distance, and other factors.

Throughout the last several weeks Kim Schweder and I have been working on ProPresenter 7. This is a program that will give us the ability to stream the service live and to hold in-person worship simultaneously. This program also gives us the ability to load in text for bible verses and songs. ProPresenter 7 also allows to store the hymns, songs, and liturgies that we use throughout the year so that we can quickly recall them if need be. We hope to be unveiling this program by the end of June/beginning of July so that we are able to make worship, both in-person and online, a smooth experience.

This is a very exciting time for us all! Despite the unknowns, we've got so many opportunities to reach to our community through music, technology and so many other ways. Ways that will draw us closer together and bring about a greater since of community.

In an effort to be transparent and keep the Faith Lutheran Community up to speed and in touch with the finances of the Church, this report will be posted in Faith Talks on a monthly basis.

The above figures show that as of the end of May the General Fund was in the Black by \$772.66. It should be noted that the expenses include a little over \$7,000 for Employee search costs and approximately \$15,000 for building improvements to the office building, that were not included in the original budget. Taking that into account, the financial operations of the Church continue to be strong.
