

INTRODUCING DANI



It is my joy to announce that we have hired a new Director of Family Life! Her name is Danielle (Dani) Vogel, she'll be starting August 4th, and you can read her introduction on the next page. I also want to share with you how we selected Dani, what made her stand out as a candidate, and why, no matter your age, we hope you'll be excited to meet her in the coming weeks.

Our search team was composed of 7 people, Cindy Kampf, Susan Riggins, Andrew Lavin, Penny Melvin, Julian Randolph, Sherrill Heinz, and me. This team

was chosen both to represent a cross section of Faith Lutheran and to include educators/youth workers and parents. Other than Julian, our teen representative, and me, every member of our team was someone who both had children/grandchildren and also had experience in education or youth ministry.

Having posted the job, listing everyone from the ELCA's websites to indeed.com, and pulling in every connection and favor that we could think of to spread the word, we interviewed five top candidates via Zoom. Though each of these five candidates was well qualified on paper, it was clear that none of them would be a good fit for our congregation. With heavy hearts we decided to start the search again from scratch. Just when we had resigned ourselves to months more of searching, we received Dani's application.

Instantly Dani's application stood out. Dani attended a Lutheran college, got a degree in education, and then furthered her education with a certification in youth and family ministry. She has been doing youth and family ministry for over a decade and in her application she included sample curriculums for Sunday school and youth groups that were not only gospel-grounded, but funny, relevant, and well-planned.

When we interviewed Dani over Zoom, we were struck by her energy, her enthusiasm, and the ways in which she spoke our theological language, wanting everyone who participates in her ministries to know that they are "beloved children of God."



At the end of July, we flew Dani out from her current home in Summerville, South Carolina to spend three days in Chico. We did our best to show Dani why Chico is an amazing place to live, with a hike in Upper Park, picnic around Sycamore Pool, a tour of CSU, and dinner at Sierra Nevada. We also asked Dani to demonstrate her skills working with children, youth, and young adults.

Dani spent Thursday night at the downtown market with the young adults, and planned and led separate activities for the teens and young children. Our team was struck by how well prepared Dani came. Not only did Dani send us a detailed list of equipment that she would need, she packed a whole suitcase of supplies, and she reached out ahead of time to ask about any special needs among the children so that she could ensure every single child had a way to participate. In my five years as pastor here, I have never seen the youth (or their parents) more engaged than in the hour Dani spent with them. After Dani's Sunday school activity, I asked the children how Dani had made them feel during her lesson. One child said, "happy," another said, "safe."

We are delighted to have Dani joining our ministry team. But Dani's role is not just to minister to young people. The Director of Family life ensures that people of every age have meaningful intentional community in which to be loved, learn, and use their unique spiritual gifts to serve others. In Christ, we are all part of God's family, the Director of Family Life connects people with their spiritual family at Faith. When Dani arrives, she'll be meeting not just with children and parents, but with you, to develop ways to support you in ensuring that you have a place at Faith's table and are empowered to reflect God's love.

When the pandemic hit Chico, we learned to do things differently. Our past president, Joel Zimbelman, and Equipping Ministry leaders, Kim and Mary Schweder had a vision that included a state-of-the-art audio/visual system that would allow members to access Sunday worship services from the comfort of their homes. Former members and friends across the country, including Pastor Ben's mother, have felt included in the work of Faith Lutheran. Patricia Colahan even bought a home in Chico to function as a home for unsheltered women, The Mercy House.



Kim and Mary also suggested the intentional use of permanent name tags. Just before the pandemic, we received 98 name tags for the members who ordered them at our last in person worship service. At many of the outdoor worship services and now at indoor services, we have added more name tags to the kiosk that Ralph Godwin built to make a total of 243 badges.

BLUE BAGS: MAKING MEALS HAPPEN

The Chico Food Project (Blue Bags) was started in 2011 by local residents Wendy Smith, Elena Carman, and Fran Kenkel who were inspired to start the food collection program after reading an article about *The Simple Gesture Program* run out of Paradise, CA. The Chico Food Project started small but now has over 1000 households donating blue bags filled with non-perishables six times a year (every other month). The program collects over 66,000 lbs. of food annually. The staples collected go to local area food banks to distribute to needy families.



Faith Lutheran Church's connection with the Blue Bag Project started in 2017 with Margaret McMillan and Molly Barnum asking Faith Lutheran Church members to share food with the hungry in our community. Members leave blue bags filled with non-perishable food items in the hallway between the Sanctuary and the Parish Hall or in the office no later than the Friday before the scheduled pick-up day. Margaret and Molly pick up the bags along with blue bags from approximately twenty-eight area homes and deliver them to St. John's Episcopal Church where they are then transported to six local food banks for distribution.

The Social Ministry Team thanks Margaret and Molly for their stalwart service to the needy in our community and for adhering to the words in Matthew 25:35, "For I was hungry, and you gave me food..."

Currently in Butte County, one in five households are at or below poverty level. That means there are a lot of Chico families who are hungry. Seventy-five percent of single moms and their children live in poverty. Food pantries have been overwhelmed by the demand and are in desperate need of a continual supply.

If you would like to become part of the Blue Bag Project, please contact Margaret or Molly. Margaret stated that on each blue bag there is a list of the pick-up dates for the year and a list of those non-perishable food items most needed. The next pick-up date is August 14th. If you do not have a blue bag and would still like to donate, you can leave the food items in a regular grocery bag in the office or hallway no later than August 13th. Pick-up days for the remainder of this year are October 9th and December 11th.

Social Ministry is one of justice and action, of human kindness and compassion. This ministry meets on the 4th Sunday of each month at I I am in the Conference Room (that's part of the main office!). It is at these meetings that we brainstorm and discuss plans of community action. This meeting is open to all who wish to attend! Some events take place annually (like gift-wrapping), while others take place monthly like Torres Shelter dinners. We would love to see some fresh faces at our meetings – no RSVP necessary, just pop on by! – or you can reach Doug (chair) at (530) 895-3754.

Fellowship Ministry has been around for ages all but in name. When you ask? When we do a Meal Train; when we host a potluck; when we send out birthday cards or deliver CDs or give flowers to one another. But starting in August, Susan Kimball is putting a name to a face, and she would like you to consider joining this ministry. As it stands there are no formal meetings, just a list of persons interested in using the gifts Christ gave them to lift up the spirits of others. Property Committee is a collection of folks interested in maintaining our campus. We invite handypeople, gardeners, electricians, plumbers, landscapers, and those with tactical and organizational skills to keep track of what needs fixing and brainstorm ideas to make life at Faith beautiful. In the back of the sanctuary, we will have a *God's Work, Your Hands Tree* starting August 15th, whose leaves will be tangible opportunities to serve at and through the church. We invite you to browse the selection and consider 'picking' one of the leaves. Each leaf will have a description of the way to serve, an estimated time commitment, and who to contact to get started.

FAITH LUTHERAN MICRO SHELTERS

Imagine a way to reduce the amount of litter that is left around Faith's campus. Imagine a way to make Faith's campus safer. And now image that both goals could be accomplished by following Jesus' call to love and serve our neighbors most in need. Faith Lutheran's council is exploring a proposal to do just that through hosting tiny houses in our back parking lot.

The Social Ministry Team is teaming up with North State Shelter Team (NSST) and Caring Choices to create a plan to establish a micro shelter on Faith Lutheran Church (FLC) grounds. Micro shelters are Conestoga Huts measuring 6 feet by 16 feet. Each hut



comes equipped with a smoke detector, light, fan, and a swamp cooler. Huts are typically placed on established church parking lots. The site would include the following facilities: a portapotty, hand-washing station, and have access to waste disposal. The space occupied by the hut and facilities would be surrounded by a six-foot garden style fence topped by one-foot framed lattice panels and incorporate a locked gate. The NSST Green Shower Trailer would drive up on set times each week to allow opportunities for showering.

We envision the huts being occupied by homeless, elderly, single women who are currently receiving a fixed income. Supportive services and case management would be provided by Caring Choices, an organization with nearly 30 years of experience caring for vulnerable populations in northern California. The goal of case management would be to give the women consistent and regular support so that they can transition from homelessness to either transitional housing and/or permanent housing within 10 to 12 months. These tiny houses would be a dignified hand up to help women transition off the streets and into a healthy life.

Our hope is for the women participating in this program to become a part of Faith's community, regardless of where they are on their faith journey. The women participating in this program would be given responsibility to help care for and maintain Faith's campus. They would be welcomed to participate in Faith's ministries to the extent that they feel comfortable. We want not four tenants, but four partners in caring for this corner of Chico.

Our initial vision is that up to four huts and facilities would be placed in the FLC parking lot for a trial period of 30 days. A site of this size would require the use of approximately five parking slots. The initial duration of the site would be for twelve-months subject to FLC renewal. While the site will take up several parking slots, we anticipate no disruptions to the day-to-day operations of FLC.

Other churches have reported that benefits to permitting the establishment of a micro shelter on church property include but are not limited to the following: reduction in trash and vandalism due to having a 24-hour presence on campus, being able to put compassion into action, and witnessing lives transformed by the power of God's grace.

This is a bold and innovative plan to answer Christ's call to serve our neighbors, there are many details to work out, and we cannot do it alone. Over the next several weeks Faith will be reaching out to neighboring businesses to present and request feedback on this plan and would like feedback from members of the congregation. An informational meeting on the topic will be held Sunday, August 15, 2021, at 11:00 am. Please bring your questions, your concerns, and your courage.



This July, we donated \$100 to Chico Housing Action Team and to the Hunger Trolley Helpers Group, both of which we will continue to give to each month. \$75 was paid to Abe's Yard Cleanup; Abe is a local yard-maintenance worker who is taking care of the yard at Mercy House. We will pay him monthly in exchange for his services, and are grateful for the opportunity to support a local business. Thanks to all of your generosity, 110 fully supplies backpacks will go to students. A Thrivent grant was used to purchase supplies needed to make sure all backpacks have a variety of supplies, and spare money from the grant will go toward procuring more packs, as is the most requested supply by the schools.



Seconded and approved unanimously.
- 5) Director of Family Life: after 3 days of interviews with the candidate, Danielle (Dani) Vogel, the search team unanimously voted to recommend Dani for the position. After discussion, a motion was made by Kimball to call Danielle Vogel as Director of Family Life. Seconded and approved unanimously.
- 6) Endowment Committee: met on 30 June 21 and submits for approval to use \$2500 for partial payment for new AC units. M/S/A
- 7) Cooling Center: with temperatures regularly over 100, Safe Space has reached out to use Faith's parish hall as a cooling center. After discussion, the motion was made by Pullium to start Wed 7/6/21 for 11 days from 3-7 PM, max 35 people, covid masks required, and once a person left the premises they would not be allowed back. M/S/A (Note: By mutual agreement, hours were extended from 2 to 8 p.m. on Friday, July 8th.)
- 8) Social Ministry Team (SMT) feels that Faith Lutheran has a responsibility to publicly address the inadequate shelter installed by the City of Chico off Hicks Lane. After discussion, a motion was made by Kimball to authorize Pastor Ben Colahan to draft a letter, to be approved by the council, and sent to the newspaper.
