

Pastor's Article

"Whoever welcomes you welcomes me, and whoever welcomes me welcomes the one who sent me." Matthew 10:40

This May will be a month of welcoming! The first Sunday in May we are invited to celebrate with First Lutheran in Orland as they welcome their new pastor! The third Sunday in May, we will welcome the largest class of new members we've had in the nearly seven years that I've been the pastor at Faith. And on the last Sunday in May, we will welcome three new people into the body of Christ through baptisms in the Big Chico Creek.

The act of welcoming someone is sacred. Jesus tells us that when we welcome one of his followers, we welcome Christ himself, we welcome God. Hebrews 13:2 says, "Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for by doing that some have entertained angels without knowing it."

Truly welcoming someone is more than saying, "hello." To welcome someone is to intentionally create space for their care, comfort, connection. When God visits Abraham at the Oaks of Mamre in Genesis 18, Abraham extends hospitality to God in three ways, saying: 1) "Let a little water be brought, and wash your feet," 2) "rest yourselves under the tree." 3) "Let me bring a little bread, that you may refresh yourselves."

Abraham is caring for God by washing God's feet. Abraham is attending to God's comfort by providing a place to rest, presumably the best place to rest. Abraham is connecting with God by serving food and talking with God while God eats.

And while most of us these days don't offer to wash our guests' feet, we likely do tend to their physical care when they arrive in our home. We likely offer to take their jackets, offer them a drink, and maybe point them to the restroom. While we probably don't invite them to rest under a tree, we likely do tend to their comfort by pointing to a comfy chair or coach, maybe even the one in which we usually sit, and invite them kick back.



And then, like Abraham, we connect with our guests by offering them something to eat while we get to know them

These ancient traditions of hospitality are very much present in our culture within the context of our homes, but this month, I invite you to ponder how you might welcome people in the context of God's home.

Whether it's First Lutheran in Orland's new pastor, the members that will officially join the church, or the newly baptized, how can you as an individual welcome these representatives of Jesus into the life we share together? Perhaps you can attend to their care by asking if they need anything, particularly if they are new to the area. Do they need furniture, or recommendations for restaurants or mechanics? Perhaps you can attend to their comfort by inviting them to sit in your favorite pew or finding out what music inspires them in worship, and letting Luke or me know, even if it's not the music that most inspires you. Perhaps you can connect with them by inviting them to join you on an outing or by inviting them to serve with you in a ministry.

We are blessed to have so many people to welcome into the life we share together in Christ. May we let them know how much we cherish them and see Christ in them through welcoming them with care, comfort, and connection.




