

¹ Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen. ² Indeed, by faith our ancestors received approval. ³ By faith we understand that the worlds were prepared by the word of God, so that what is seen was made from things that are not visible.

⁸ By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to set out for a place that he was to receive as an inheritance, and he set out, not knowing where he was going. ⁹ By faith he stayed for a time in the land he had been promised, as in a foreign land, living in tents, as did Isaac and Jacob, who were heirs with him of the same promise. ¹⁰ For he looked forward to the city that has foundations, whose architect and builder is God. ¹¹ By faith, with Sarah's involvement, he received power of procreation, even though he was too old, because he considered him faithful who had promised. ¹² Therefore from one person, and this one as good as dead, descendants were born, "as many as the stars of heaven and as the innumerable grains of sand by the seashore." ¹³ All of these died in faith without having received the promises, but from a distance they saw and greeted them. They confessed that they were strangers and foreigners on the earth, ¹⁴ for people who speak in this way make it clear that they are seeking a homeland. ¹⁵ If they had been thinking of the land that they had left behind, they would have had opportunity to return. ¹⁶ But as it is, they desire a better homeland, that is, a heavenly one. Therefore God is not ashamed to be called their God; indeed, he has prepared a city for them.





August's Mission: To provide school supplies and for students at Rosedale Elementary School, Rosedale has 565 students Grades K-5. For over 10 years Faith Lutheran has provided different schools in Chico with school supplies. Last year we began our relationship with Rosedale during God's Work Our Hands. It is the one school in Chico that has what is called 2 way immersion in learning. Chico Unified School District's Two-Way Immersion Program groups native Spanish speakers with native English speakers in the same classroom. Ideally, one-half of the students are Spanish speakers and one-half are English speakers. Positive interaction between groups ensures that our students learn from each other. As friendships build, children become excited about working and playing in two languages.

Why it Matters: We choose to provide these supplies because there is always a need for more supplies than what is budgeted. This is a need that goes on through out the school year. When students and teaches don't have to worry about the supplies that support the teaching, then they can focus on learning.



Sermon Conversations

After worship on Sundays in the Sanctuary, throughout August

Pastor Ben spends a week crafting a sermon that he hopes will move your heart to recognize your own sin and trust in God's grace. He invites you to reflect with one another and with him how the sermon affected you. Stay in the sanctuary after worship each Sunday in August to discuss together questions such as: What happened to you as you listened to this sermon? What did you hear that you are eager to share with another person? For what and/or for whom does the sermon prompt you to pray?

Constructive Conversations: Immigration August 17th after Worship in the Fellowship Hall

Following up on July's workshop on how to have constructive conversations about challenging topics, Faith Lutheran is launching a series of monthly conversations using a tool developed by the Berkeley Rotary Club. Each month we will select a single topic to discuss and then break into groups of three. Within each group, one person shares their views on the topic for 2 minutes, one person reflects back that person's views for 1 minute, and one person keeps time. Then the roles rotate until all three people have done each role. In this series, we will have people participate in multiple groups so that we can hear more varied perspectives. Between groups, you'll be asked to write what commonalities you heard from the group and what differences. At the end, we'll ask what common ground we can act on. Based on the responses for our first workshop, the topic for August 17th will be immigration. The workshop will take place after worship in the fellowship hall. The topic in September will be camping in public spaces.

After worship, we will head to the Sacramento River near Scotty's Landing to baptize 2 new members into the body of Christ and give thanks for each of our baptisms!
