### **SUNDAY NIGHT PRAISE**

For the past 6 months, our council, staff, and a ministry team have been asking the question: how might we share Christ's love with people who, for whatever reason, will not attend our existing worship service. To answer that question, we have visited four growing and vibrant congregations in the area, each with very different worship services. We have also been talking with people that we know who we think would appreciate Faith Lutheran, but who say they aren't interested in our current service.

In visiting these other congregations, I was struck by the variety of musical styles and moods in places attracting young families. We visited a service that felt like a talent show in the best possible way; worship was inviting one group after another to come to the front of the church and offer their own style of music as a praise to God as the congregation cheered them on. We worshipped at a church where there were only three musicians, a singer, a drummer, and a guitarist/pianist. This simple team created poignant and prayerful music of praise that both uplifted the heart and left me with a sense of peace. One service felt like a rock concert, with strobe lights, fog machines, and an incredibly talented band who turned the volume up to 11 to pump up the congregation to praise God. We also visited an Orthodox church covered in icons, resounding with ancient chants, and full of young families.

We asked ourselves what was working well in these other spaces, but also what we could offer that was lacking. We came to four major conclusions. 1) What seems to be working well in other congregations is a less complex liturgy that doesn't require a church background to understand; what we can offer is a service that still grounds people in ancient tradition. 2) What seems to be working well in other congregations is music focused on praising God through a lead vocalist, keyboard, guitar and drums; what we can offer is an intimate experience of praising God in which the focus is not on the musicians but the message of the music. 3) What seems to be working well in other congregations is an emphasis on family ministry; what we can offer is a ministry that welcomes and affirms the variety of shapes in which families come. 4) We noticed that in other cities there are many congregations offering worship times that allow for people who travel, work, or have children's sport on Sunday morning; in Chico, we only saw two congregations doing this.

From these observations, the council decided to set a vision for a Sunday night praise service. This service would be at 5pm on Sunday evening and would have a streamlined liturgy, with an emphasis on singing praises to God and preaching. Communion would happen less frequently, about once a month. A small band of 3-5 people would lead an intimate experience of contemporary music with theological depth. To maintain our sense of connection to our historic legacy, the aesthetics would focus on an ancient reverence for the cross. Instead of spotlights on musicians, we would use lights, fabrics, and candles to create a visual focus on the beautiful cross that hangs in our sanctuary. I've included a picture from the Taize community in France as an inspiration.



Our hope is not to create two services that members must choose between, but to create an additional opportunity for our existing members to enrich their spiritual life. This Sunday night praise service is meant to be distinct enough in both mood and time that we hope people will consider attending both services, if not every Sunday, then when they could use a re-set on Sunday evening before they begin their week. Most importantly, we hope this Sunday night praise service will give our members an opportunity to invite those friends and family members who have been reluctant or unable to come to our current service.

While we are excited to offer this opportunity for worship to Chico, we have many details to consider first. We have not yet set a start date. Over the next month, council members will be inviting various ministry teams to meet and help us think through the logistics, implications, and practical needs for what it would take to offer such a service. When you are invited to such a meeting, please come and help us plan how we might offer a truly excellent service of praise and proclamation for the people of Chico who do not yet know Christ's love. And if you are excited by this possibility, please don't wait for the council to reach out to you, let me know how you'd like to help us more fully be a community reflecting God's love with a place at the table for everyone.

**August's Mission:** To provide school supplies and for students at Rosedale Elementary School. Rosedale has 565 students Grades K-5. For over 10 years Faith Lutheran has provided different schools in Chico with school supplies. Last year we began our relationship with Rosedale during God's Work Our Hands. It is the one school in Chico that has what is called 2 way immersion in learning. Chico Unified School District's Two-Way Immersion Program groups native Spanish speakers with native English speakers in the same classroom. Ideally, one-half of the students are Spanish speakers and one-half are English speakers. Positive interaction between groups ensures that our students learn from each other. As friendships build, children become excited about working and playing in two languages.

Why it Matters: We choose to provide these supplies because there is always a need for more supplies than what is budgeted. This is a need that goes on through out the school year. When students and teaches don't have to worry about the supplies that support the teaching, then they can focus on learning.

**How Can You make a Difference:** You can help by picking up a few items from the list below on your usual shopping trips. We would ask you pay attention to specific items like pencils and dry erase Expo markers. Bring them by Faith on Sunday morning or during the week during the month of August:


#### The answer is: not at all.

### PASTOR'S BIBLE STUDY TUESDAYS, 5-6PM ONLINE


