







PREPARING FOR LENT

"God does not need your good works, but your neighbor does" – Martin Luther

On Wednesday, February 18th, we begin the season of Lent. Lent is a forty day period of preparing to journey with Jesus to the cross. These forty days mirror the forty days in the wilderness with which Jesus prepared for his public ministry by fasting and resisting temptation.

For centuries, Christians have undergone three spiritual disciplines during Lent: fasting, prayer, and almsgiving. We do these three things not in order to earn our salvation, for Christ has accomplished our salvation on the cross. We do these three things to discover what our salvation means.

To fast is to abstain from something. Historically, people have fasted from types of food: meat, fats, and sweets. But today, there is so much more that we consume: media, substances, shopping. We consume these things because we think we need them. To fast is to celebrate the truth that God gives us what we need. This Lent, what could you fast from that would help you know that God is the one who sustains you?

To pray is to connect with God. If we are to remove something we have relied on through fasting, we must intentionally replace it with God's presence. There are many ways to pray, to attune ourselves to God's presence. You can read scripture or a devotional which we offer in the office. You can recite the Lord's prayer, and as Martin Luther suggests, pause after each line and ask God how it applies to your own life. You can simply tell God what you are feeling in your heart. I recommend setting a timer so that you give yourself a good amount of time to spend with God without worrying about the clock.

Start with a five minute timer, and when that amount of time feels comfortable, add five more minutes.

To pray is to celebrate that God is always with you, and that even when you don't hear God, God hears you. This Lent, how could you pray that would help you know God's presence in your life?

To give alms is to give to those in need. There are many ways to give. You can give of your money, either directly to someone in need or through an organization like our congregation. You can also give of your time and energy by volunteering or caring for someone in need. Historically, the money people saved by fasting from luxurious food has gone towards almsgiving. But the same can be true of time. If you're spending less time in front of a screen, use some of that time for prayer and some for service. To give alms is to celebrate that your life includes people beyond you, and that because of your faith in God, you are free from thinking only of your own need and free to care for others. This Lent, how could you give that would help you know you are connected to other people?

At the end of Lent we come to the cross on which Jesus died for our sins. That cross is the promise of forgiveness which transforms our lives and sets us free. Each Sunday we will hear stories of how Jesus' grace transforms and sets people free in scripture. Ask yourself how, through fasting, prayer, and almsgiving, you can experience the forgiveness of the cross that allows you to be sustained by God, surrounded by God, and set free to live for others by God.

Hallelujah Anyway: Rediscovering Mercy by Anne Lamott is a book that explores finding meaning in life through radical kindness, forgiveness, and self-acceptance, even amidst chaos and personal flaws. Lamott argues that mercy—giving yourself and others permission to be imperfect—is essential for a more honest and connected life, and she uses her signature humor and honesty to discuss how to find it in everyday moments, from small acts of kindness to larger spiritual concepts. Lent is often a time when people refrain from saying "Halleluiah" in grief for sin, but this book helps us discover how we can praise God even in our brokenness. Offered as part of Just Older Youth Seniors (JOYS), the 2nd and 4th Monday of each month at 10:30am starting February 23 in Room 7.

Faith Lutheran Church's Stephen Ministry Program

- What is it? Stephen Ministry is a world-wide program in which trained lay people provide one-to-one distinctively Christian care to individuals who are hurting. We help people going through life difficulties such as bereavement, loss of health, faith crises, caregiver's fatigue, job loss, divorce and more. Faith has provided Stephen Ministry for 25 years!
- How does it work? Stephen Ministers meet weekly with their care receiver to provide spiritual support, encouragement and prayer. They listen non-judgmentally and have no agenda to be met. This ministry is free and confidential.
- Are you interested in becoming a Stephen Minister? Faith will start a training class in coming weeks. After applying and being interviewed, trainees complete 50 hours of training, then take part in twice-monthly supervision and continuing education. Contact either of our Stephen Leaders, Gen or Jamie, through the church office to learn more.
- Are you interested in having a Stephen Minister or know someone might? Care receivers are not required to be members of or attend Faith Lutheran Church but must simply be open to Christian care. Please contact Pastor Ben, Gen, or Jamie through the church office.





The above figures represent the General Fund activity for the first 6 months of the current fiscal year. As shown Expenses have exceeded Income by \$32,048.56. In past years income in December has been very good and has brought in enough to make up for any Budget Shortfalls. Unfortunately this didn't happen this year. We had enough in Savings to cover the current shortfall. However, the savings account is almost depleted and to continue with the current programs without making major cuts, General Fund income must increase substantially. Please prayerfully consider increasing your General Fund giving.
